Business Attraction

LEDC is tasked with marketing the strengths of the Liberty area to attract new business. Through its attraction efforts, LEDC promotes the assets and advantages of conducting business in Liberty to prospects outside the Liberty area, the community as a whole and LEDC Investors.

Business Retention and Expansion

We are committed to retaining the existing businesses in the Liberty area and facilitate their growth and expansion. Letter From the Chairman

What a year 2021 has been for the Liberty area in the development of industrial building space! The Northpoint, Opus and BCB Development industrial developments represent over \$500 Million dollars in capital investment and are projected to create 3,500 to 5,000 jobs in the next three to five years. Planned expansions at the Ford Stamping Plant and Hallmark Distribution Center will create more than 400 new jobs. Finally, Walgreens recently announced a \$30 Million investment in a 65,000 square foot, micro-fulfillment center at Liberty Commerce Center. The facility will create 200 jobs and over \$8 Million in payroll. Simply an amazing year!

Another strategic priority for the LEDC is an emphasis on supporting entrepreneurship and small business through LINK Business Facilitation. During the first year program facilitator Jolinda McClintock met with 35 entrepreneurs and small businesses to assist them with business concepts, team building, marketing, financial management and goal setting. Jolinda also works with the LINK Resource Team to make connections and identify resources, such as banking, legal, accounting, insurance, etc. within our community to help these businesses thrive. Small business is the backbone of a community and facilitates the creation of new employment opportunities.

Finally, I want recognize Ralph Boots, LEDC Executive Director, and the City of Liberty for working closely in partnership to make 2021 a very successful year. Strong public and private partnerships are critical in today's complex business world. Additionally, many thanks to all the investors, stakeholders and supporters involved since the inception of LEDC to make this year happen! Liberty has demonstrated the ability to effectively compete for prospective company expansion and investment. If you are currently a partner, thank you for your support and investment. Throughout the pandemic, Liberty Hospital focused on ٠ serving the community by working with key community partners to open Operation Safe, the high throughput COVID-19 vaccination clinic at Cerner, and supporting ongoing education and vaccination efforts. In addition, this year the hospital opened its Breast Care Center and The Cosmetic & Plastic Surgery Clinic; received accolades for the highest quality stroke and chest pain care from the American Heart Association, American Stroke Association and American College of Cardiology; and won Best of the Northland gold awards in the Hospital, Emergency Room, Cardiologist, Family Physicians, Sports Medicine, Urgent Care categories. Most recently, Liberty Hospital was the only hospital in the Northland to earn an "A" grade for its dedication to patient safety from The Leapfrog Group, a national organization that rates how well hospitals protect patients from preventable medical errors, injuries and infections.

• Hallmark Ceremonial groundbreaking October 06, 2021 of Liberty Heartland Logistics, under Opus Development, will be adding three industrial buildings totaling almost 1.66 M SF of build-to-suit/speculative industrial development space near West Heartland Drive and Shepherd Road. the build-to-suit building will house more than 847,000 square feet for an expansion of the Hallmark distribution center. The other two buildings are being constructed with tenants yet to be determined.

KC Tech Academy



KC Tech Academy is continuing to grow student enrollment and gain traction as the go-to program for K-12 students looking for a CTE experience outside of their typical classroom. Thanks to many northland employers, school districts, and other strategic partners that see the value KC Tech can bring, we have almost doubled our enrollment and are currently serving 34 students for the 2021/22 school year. We will be adding an adult program soon. With a grant awarded through Missouri One Start, students are getting hands-on experience on state-of-the-art equipment in the high level technical skills employers are seeking such as electrical, automation, robotics, and more. With our competency-based program, in May 2021, 13 out of our 15 graduates were placed in industry relevant positions throughout the KC Metro area. We continue to focus on our mission of, "Delivering industry-led education to empower life-ready manufacturing professionals", to help build a skilled KC workforce. Stay tuned for some significant and exciting news from KCTA in the coming months!



• Liberty EDC hosted a luncheon November 16th at Conrad's Restaurant to introduce employers to State Tech located in Linn, MO. State Tech is Missouri's number 1 two year technical institute. President Dr. Strong with State Technical College spoke about over 40 programs they offer as well as opportunities to for employers to connect with students before they graduate.
